Can be a candidate?	No – if candidate for a <i>contested</i> office in election held on that day → cannot serve in a precinct for which candidate appears on ballot. Can be a relative of candidate?	No – if related within the second degree of consanguinity or affinity to an <i>opposed</i> candidate → cannot serve in a precinct for which candidate appears on ballot.	No – if related within the second degree of consanguinity or affinity to an <i>opposed</i> candidate → cannot serve in a precinct for which candidate appears on ballot.
Can be an employee of candidate?	No – if candidate is <i>opposed</i> and employer of judge → cannot serve in a precinct for which candidate appears on ballot.	No – if candidate is <i>opposed</i> and employer of clerk → cannot serve in a precinct for which candidate appears on ballot.
Can be employee of campaign?	No – if campaign manager or treasurer. Unadvisable – If serving other role within campaign.	No – if campaign manager or treasurer. Unadvisable – If serving other role within campaign.
Can be an public officeholder?	No – if they hold elective public office.	No – if they hold elective public office.
Can be convicted of election offense?	No – if finally convicted of election related offense.	No – if finally convicted of election related offense.
